First Stop...Simmzy's

Simmzy's is a fantastic GastroPub on Second Street in Belmont Shore, Long Beach that has amazing food, craft beer and environmentally friendly local kegged wine selection. I have never, ever, been disappointed visiting Simmsy's. Needless to say I am a big fan. Some of the highly acclaimed items on the menu are the Brussel Sprouts (if you like anchovy), Pork Belly Masa Cakes, Shrimp Avocado Salad and of course the wood fire oven Pizzas!! This place is pretty fantastic. The beer

selection is extensive. The favorites of the night were: Sweetgrass APA from Grand Teton for me and Delena, Smog City Porter for Linda, Ballast Point Sextant for Teela, Latitude 33 Double Hump and Borg Brugghas for Eva. I called ahead Thursday to tell them that I had about 12 people in my party and they were very accommodating. They do not take "reservations" but it is still advisable to call ahead to warn the staff. They will keep a table available.





Second stop...Brix at the Shore

Brix at the Shore is a fantastic stop for the craft beer girl. The craft beer selections were very impressive and the food menu was deli sandwich heaven. At this stop we did not sample the amazing food. But what we did sample was amazing service, beer and ambiance. Clean, modern and stylish is the theme at Brix. Some of the highlights at Brix were the few Stouts they had on draft for our stout lovers Sylvia and Linda. As an appreciator of sours I must say the highlight of the night for Beverly and I was the bottle we enjoyed from Cascade Brewing, The Vine. It was amazing. A sour beer blend made with fresh pressed white grapes. This beer was amazing enough for Bev and I to seek it out at every local Bev Mo, Total Wine, Cal Heights and Stearn Liquor. Let's just say it was the answer to our beautiful sour desire that evening.



Final Stop...Tavern on Second.

Tavern on Second is yet another spectacular stop for the craft beer lover. The selection on draft is great with a style for anyone. Sour, Brown to IPA and it was very pleasing to each of our individual tastes. At Tavern we had the opportunity to enjoy the food. Items off the food menu we enjoyed where the Garlic Fries and make it yourself open flame S'mores.... Yes, from the pics I would say the S'mores may have been the highlight of the night. The S'mores were interactive and pleasing for all the senses. Having a flaming ball of fire near my face was pretty exciting and fun. I recommend it. Beer favorites of the night at Tavern were Sculpin for Delana and myself, a bottle of Liefmans Cuvee Brute Cherry for Beverly, Big Bad Baptist for Sylvia and Black Market Brown for Linda. Tavern was the final stop for the evening. We had our fill of all the fantastic craft beer that we could stand for the evening. We were lucky enough to have a designated driver come pick us up and drive us all home safely which was a perfect end to a fantastic night.
